Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project proposes construction of a fire station on a one-acre parcel in eastern Williams, adjacent to and north of Ella Street. The total footprint of the station would be approximately 11,167 square feet, of which 10,651 square feet would be occupied by the station building and 516 square feet would be occupied by an ambulatory area supporting emergency medical services. The project would be connected to the water and sewer systems operated by the City of Williams.
